2025 NOTICE OF MUNICIPAL GENERAL ELECTION AND QUALIFYING INFORMATION

The City of Jonesboro municipal election will be held on Tuesday, November 4, 2025 to elect three (3) Councilmembers. The Mayor and City Council are responsible for setting policies, enacting legislation, and providing political leadership for the community. City Council Work Sessions are held on the first (1st) Monday of each month. The Regular Council Meetings are held on the second (2nd) Monday of each month. Both meetings begin at 6:00 p.m. and are held in the Council Chambers at Jonesboro City Hall, 1859 City Center Way, Jonesboro, Georgia 30236. Additional meetings may be scheduled throughout the year as needed.

Clayton County Department of Elections will administer/conduct the City of Jonesboro's 2025 Municipal General Election. City elections are non-partisan. Elected officials serve terms of four (4) years and until their respective successors are elected and sworn in. The City Clerk serves as the Qualifying Officer and will be the person to receive your Notice of Candidacy and Affidavit.

Certain documents are required to be filed with the Georgia Government Transparency and Campaign Finance Commission, or GGTCFC (formerly known as the State Ethics Commission). The website address is http://ethics.ga.gov/and candidates should familiarize themselves with all forms, publications, and the requirements of candidacy for public office. Also, all candidates should familiarize themselves with the Constitution of the State of Georgia, City of Jonesboro "Code of Ethics", and may find the Rules of the State Election Board helpful as well.

QUALIFYING PERIOD:

Pursuant to § O.C.G.A. 21-2-132, qualifying for the election will take place at Jonesboro City Hall beginning Monday, August 18, 2025 through Wednesday, August 20, 2025 from 8:30 a.m. until 12:00 p.m. and 1:00 p.m. until 4:30 p.m.

QUALIFYING FEES:

A municipality shall fix and publish a qualifying fee for each office to be filled in the upcoming election. Such fee shall be three (3) percent of the total gross salary of the office paid in the proceeding calendar year. Pursuant to § O.C.G.A. 21-2-131(a), the qualifying fees are:

■ \$277.20 for each Councilmember's seat

GEORGIA LAW REQUIREMENTS:

Shall not have been convicted of violation of primary or election laws, malfeasance in office, or felony involving moral turpitude or conviction of domestic violence.

Shall not be the holder of any public funds illegally.

QUALIFYING REQUIREMENTS:

No person shall be eligible for the office of Councilmember of said city unless he/she has been a resident of said city for a period of one (1) year immediately preceding the time that he/she qualified to run for office.

Shall have attained or passed his/her twenty-first (21) birthday.

No person's name shall be placed on the ballot as a candidate for Councilmember unless such person shall have filed a Notice of Candidacy and shall have paid the qualifying fee to the office of the City Clerk.

QUALIFICATIONS TO HOLD PUBLIC OFFICE IN THE CITY OF JONESBORO

The qualifying fee for the at-large council seats is \$277.20, which is 3% of the total gross salary of the preceding year. Said election shall be to elect three (3) Councilmembers. Each candidate shall file a Notice of Candidacy in the office of the City Clerk of Jonesboro and must meet the qualifications of the Charter and Code of the City of Jonesboro, as well as all applicable state and constitutional laws.

Pursuant to the Jonesboro City Charter, Sec. 2.11 – City Council Terms and Qualifications for Office are as follows:

- (a) The mayor and councilmember shall serve for terms of four years or until their respective successors are elected and qualified.
- (b) No person shall be eligible for the office of mayor or councilmember unless he/she, at the time that he/she has qualified to run for office:
 - (1.) Has been a resident of the city for a period of one year;
 - (2.) Has reached the age of 21;
 - (3.) Is a qualified voter; and
 - (4.) Has not been convicted of any crime involving moral turpitude.
- (c) No person's name shall be placed on the ballot as a candidate for mayor or councilmember unless such person shall have filed a Notice of Candidacy and shall have paid the qualifying fee to the City Clerk of said city.

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF JONESBORO, GEORGIA, TO CALL AND AUTHORIZE THE 2025 MUNICIPAL ELECTION; TO FIX AND PUBLISH THE QUALIFYING FEE; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

WHEREAS, the governing authority of the City of Jonesboro, Georgia (the "City")

is the Mayor and Council thereof; and

WHEREAS, Pursuant to O.C.G.A. § 212-131(a)(A), the City Council shall fix and

publish the qualifying fees for the municipal offices to be filled in the upcoming election. The qualifying fee shall be equal to three percent (3%) of the total gross salary of the office paid in the preceding calendar

year:

WHEREAS. Section 5.13 of the City Charter states that all elections in the City shall

be determined by plurality. The person receiving a plurality of votes

cast shall be elected.

WHEREAS, the Mayor and the members of the City Council wish to order said

General Municipal Election to proceed as provided by law.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Mayor and Council of the City of Jonesboro and it is resolved by the authority of said City Council that:

Section 1: The City of Jonesboro Municipal Election is hereby called pursuant to

the requirements of the Georgia Constitution, State Law and the City

Charter: and

Section 2: The Municipal Election shall be held on November 4, 2025; and

Section 3: Three council seats (at-large) will be up for reelection. The incumbents

in these council seats are Don Dixon, Bobby Lester, and Billy Powell.

Section 4: Qualifying for candidates will be held at the Jonesboro City Hall, 1859

City Center Way, Jonesboro, GA 30236 on Monday, August 18, 2025, Tuesday, August 19, 2025, and Wednesday, August 20, 2025. The hours of qualifying on these dates shall be between the hours of 8:30 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. and 1:00 p.m. to 4:30 p.m. The qualifying fee for the at-large council seats is \$277.20, which is 3% of the total gross salary of the preceding year. Each candidate shall file a notice of candidacy in the office of the City Clerk of Jonesboro and must meet

the qualifications of the Charter and Code of the City of Jonesboro, as well as all applicable state and constitutional laws; and

Section 5: All elections in the city shall be determined by plurality. The three candidates receiving the highest numbers of votes shall be elected.

CITY OF JONESBORO, GEORGIA CODE OF ORDINANCE - ARTICLE V, SECTION 5.11

Sec. 5.11. - Election of the City Council and Mayor.

- (a) There shall be a municipal general election on the first Tuesday after the first Monday in November in odd-numbered years.
- (b) There shall be elected three (3) councilmembers in the 1997 election and at every other election thereafter. The mayor's seat and the remaining city council seats shall be filled at the election alternating with the first election so that a continuing body is created as provided for in the initial election held under this charter.
- (c) The mayor and councilmembers holding office on the effective date of this charter shall continue in office as elected officers of the city.

Sec. 86-488. - Exempt signs.

The following signs are allowed and exempt from the authorization and permit provisions in this article but, notwithstanding, must comply with all other applicable requirements in this article, the 2005 zoning ordinance, and this Code:

- (1) Except as limited by <u>section 86-495</u>, window signs so long as they do not exceed 25 percent of the total window area exposed to view to the public.
- (2) Non-seasonal flags. In non-residential zoning districts, each lot that is less than five acres in area shall be allowed a maximum of three non-seasonal flags and each lot that is greater than five acres in area shall be allowed a maximum of six non-seasonal flags. In residential zoning districts, each lot shall be allowed a maximum of three non-seasonal flags. Seasonal flags for recognized holiday and cultural observance decorations (such as a Memorial Day observation) shall be on display for not more than a time period a week before and until a week after a recognized public holiday or observance. They shall not be located in any public rights-of-way.
- (3) Each lot is entitled to one sign that is less than 36 square inches in area and that must be placed in any of the following areas:
 - a. On the front of every building, every unit in a multiple unit building, residence, or structure;
 - b. On each side of an authorized United States Postal Service mailbox; or
 - c. On one post which measures no more than 48 inches in height and four inches in width and shall not be placed in a public right-of-way.
- (4) Temporary signs that meet the following criteria:
 - a. For each lot during the period that it is being developed under an active building permit issued by the city, one sign that is no more than 12 square feet in area, is no more than six feet in height to the top of the sign component when placed and standing in ground and is not placed within a public right-of-way.
 - b. For each lot in a residential zoning district, one temporary sign that is no more than five square feet in area, is no more than four feet in height to the top of the sign component when placed and standing in ground and is not placed within a public right-of-way.
 - c. For each lot of less than five acres in a non-residential zoning district, one temporary sign that is no more than five square feet in area, is no more than four feet in height to the top of the sign component when placed and standing in ground and is not placed within a public right-of-way. For each lot of more than five acres in a non-residential zoning district, two temporary signs, each sign shall be no more than five square feet in area, no more than four feet in height to the top of the sign component when placed and standing in ground, and not placed within a public right-of-way.

- d. For each lot during the period in which it is listed "for sale" or "for rent", one temporary sign that is no more than 12 square feet in area, is no more than six feet in height to the top of the sign component when placed and standing in ground and is not placed within a public right-of-way.
- e. For each lot, additional temporary signs that, collectively, have a total area of no more than 32 square feet, do not exceed four signs in number at any one time, are not placed within a public right-of-way, and are removed within 90 days after being erected.
- f. Standard informational signs. No more than three standard informational signs at a time per lot and not exceeding three square feet, supported by braces or uprights placed into the ground. For each period that starts 45 days immediately preceding a federal, state, county, or city election or referendum, including primary elections, special elections, and runoff elections, and that ends five days after said election or referendum, there shall be no limit to the number of standard information signs per lot. Standard informational signs may not be located in any public rights-of-way or easements, unless specifically authorized by the city.
- g. Mass transit graphics. Graphic images mounted on trains or duly licensed mass transit vehicles that legally pass through the city.

Any sign erected under this section shall not be calculated as part of the overall signage allowed per lot by any other provision of this article. Temporary signs erected or left within a public right-of-way or easement are subject to confiscation and disposal by the city.

Newly Elected Officials Training

The Georgia General Assembly passed legislation (O.C.G.A. 36-45-1) requiring all persons elected as member of a municipal governing authority who were not serving as members of a municipal governing authority on July 1, 1990 to attend and satisfactory complete a training program specifically designed for newly elected municipal officials. The Georgia Municipal Association and the University of Georgia's Carl Vinson Institute of Government are pleased to provide this required training to Georgia's newly elected municipal officials.

The Newly Elected Officials Institute provides an opportunity for mayors and councilmembers to increase their knowledge and understanding of city government, especially as it relates to the role and responsibility of the elected official. The training provides information designed to increase the awareness of the legal, financial, and ethical responsibilities of the city officials. Further, the course provides six hours of credit towards the voluntary training certificate program available through the Municipal Training Institute.

Municipal elected officials that have served before and have been re-elected are required to take the Newly Elected Official Institute again if they have been out of office for more than four years. The Newly Elected Officials institute is offered annually, generally in February and March.

Declaration of Intention to Accept Campaign Contributions

Reference: O.C.G.A. § 21-5-30(g)

- Must be filed PRIOR to accepting contributions.
- A candidate's personal funds expended for their campaign, except for payment of a qualifying fee, are considered campaign contributions.
- A new form must be filed if there is a break in office or if accepting contributions for a different office.
- County and Municipal candidates file this form with their local filing officer. All other candidates file with the Commission.

Registration Form for a Campaign Committee

Reference: O.C.G.A. §§ 21-5-3(2); 21-5-30(b)

- This form registers a candidate's campaign committee.
- A committee is required only if a candidate designates someone to file reports, accept money, or expend money on behalf of the campaign.
- A Chairperson and Treasurer are required to form a committee; however, they can be the same person and can be the candidate.
 If either position is vacant, the committee cannot accept contributions.
- The committee registration will remain in effect until the registration is canceled by the committee or the candidate.
- Filed with the Commission

Choosing the Option of Separate Accounting

Reference: O.C.G.A. §§ 21-5-43(a)(2); 21-5-30 (c)

- Permits candidates to accept contributions for multiple elections within an election cycle. Thus, a candidate may accept contributions for the general election in an election cycle even if the primary election has not occurred.

- A TBD is a report used to report individual contributions (including loans) of \$1,000.00 or more

For candidates, candidate's campaign committees, organizations or persons other than candidates Committee – (required by the State Ethics in Government Act for January 31, 2014 General Primary and General Election).

Candidates or campaign committees which accept contributions, make expenditures designed to bring about the nomination or election of a candidate, or have filed a declaration of intention to accept campaign contributions pursuant to subsection (g) of Code Section 21-5-30c shall file campaign contribution disclosure reports in compliance with the following schedule:

- 1. In each non-election year on June 30 and December 31;
- 2. In each election year:
 - 1. On January 31, April 30, June 30, September 30, October 25, and December 31.

Candidates who have completed an "Affidavit of a Candidate's Intent Not to Exceed \$2,500 In Contributions and /or Expenditures", and does not exceed \$2,500 in contributions or expenditures then the candidate SHALL not have to file a report under O.C.G.A. 21.5.34(c)

CANDIDATE REQUIREMENTS

For the purposes of reporting, a candidate is a filer in an Election Year. There are four ways you can achieve candidate status for the purposes of reporting. Ask yourself...

- Have you filed a <u>Declaration of Intention to Accept Campaign</u>
 Contributions form?
- Have you qualified for election or qualified for nomination for election?
- Have you received <u>contributions</u> or made <u>expenditures</u> designed to bring about your election or nomination for election?
- Have you authorized a <u>campaign committee</u> to receive contributions or make expenditures designed to bring about your election or nomination for election?

All of these actions confer candidate status. If you answered **YES** to any of the questions above, even if you have not yet formally qualified as a candidate, you are required to file Campaign Contribution Disclosure Reports. The definition by the ACT for Candidate is found under O.C.G.A. 21-5-3(4).

Now That I Have Achieved Candidate Status... What's Next?

If you have not done so already, file a <u>Declaration of Intention to Accept Contributions</u> – Form DOI

Reference: O.C.G.A. § 21-5-30 (g)

Anyone who is not already a public officer and who plans to run for public office must file a Declaration of Intention to Accept Campaign Contributions BEFORE accepting such contributions. No such declaration is required of persons who are public officers and who plan to run for the same public office they currently hold. Form DOI is filed with your local filing entity if running for a local office.

File a form for Choosing Option of Separate Account - Form COOSA

Reference: O.C.G.A. § 21-5-43 (a) (2)

A candidate who wishes to accept contributions for more than one election at a time shall separately account for such campaign contributions and shall file an "Option to Choose Separate Accounting" form with the Commission prior to accepting contributions for any election other than the candidate's next upcoming election. A candidate is only required to file one Form COOSA which shall be utilized for all subsequent elections to the same office, regardless of whether an election occurs in a new election cycle.

Do I Need To Form A Candidate Committee?

If you have designated someone to file your reports or if anyone is collecting your contributions or expending your contributions, you have a campaign committee.

File a <u>Registration Form for a Candidate's Campaign Committee - Form RC.</u> **Reference:** O.C.G.A. § 21-5-3(2) and O.C.G.A. § 21-5-30(b)

The term "campaign committee" as it relates to the candidate means the candidate, person(s) or committee which accepts contributions or makes expenditures for the purpose of bringing about the nomination or election of an individual to any elected office. If a candidate has a campaign committee, the name and address of the committee, its chairperson, treasurer and the candidate must be registered with the Commission prior to accepting any contributions. Any substantive changes to registration information of a committee must be up-dated with the Commission within 7 business days.

"Registration Form for a Candidate's Campaign Committee" is filed with the Commission. No candidate may have more than one campaign committee. No contributions may be accepted at any time there is a vacancy in either the position of chairperson or treasurer. One person may serve as both chairperson and treasurer.

When a candidate is elected to office, the candidate's campaign committee registration will remain in effect as long as the candidate remains in office until and unless the registration is canceled by the campaign commit-tee or the candidate.

Campaign Record Keeping

Detailed records must be kept of all contributions received and expenditures made. Records must be maintained by the candidate or treasurer of a campaign committee and may be inspected by the Commission at any time. The right of inspection may be enforced by the Courts in the State of Georgia. Records of the accounts kept by a candidate or candidate's committee are required to be preserved for three years from the termination date of the candidate's campaign. However, since public disclosures are maintained for not less than five years, candidates are advised to keep records for at least five years.

Contributions of money received by the candidate or the candidate's campaign committee must be promptly deposited in a **separate campaign depository account** (separate from the personal banking account of the candidate) opened and maintained for this purpose. The account may be an interest bearing account and any interest earned will be deemed a contribution to the campaign committee; interest earned is not payable to the candidate.

Disposition of Contributions - O.C.G.A. § 21-5-33

Contributions to a candidate, a campaign committee, or a public officer holding elective office and any proceeds from investing such contributions shall be utilized only to defray ordinary and necessary expenses, which may include any loan of money from a candidate or public officer holding elective office to the campaign committee of such candidate or such public officer, incurred in connection with such candidate's campaign for elective office or such public officer's fulfilment or retention of such office.

All contributions received by a candidate or such candidate's campaign committee or a public officer holding elective office in excess of those necessary to defray expenses may only be used as follows:

Contribution to a charitable organization;
Transfer to national, state, or local committee of any political party;
Pro rata repayment to persons making such contribution;
Use in future campaigns for the same office;
Repayment of any prior campaign debt.

Anonymous Contribution

Anonymous contributions are prohibited. Any cash contribution received by a candidate who fails to record the name and address of the contributor and the amount of the contribution is an anonymous contribution.

If an anonymous contribution is received it must be transmitted to the Office of Treasury and Fiscal Services 200 Piedmont Ave, Suite 1202 West Tower, Atlanta, GA 30334. Telephone # (404) 656-2168. The recipient must also notify the Commission of the receipt of the contribution and its subsequent transmittal to the office of Treasury and Fiscal Services.

Maximum Contribution Limits

The Act, specifically O.C.G.A.§ 21-5-41(k) directs the Commission to raise or lower the maximum contribution limits set forth in O.C.G.A.§ 21-5-41 by \$100 increments based on inflation or deflation as determined by the Consumer Price index published by the US Dept. of Labor's Bureau of Labor Statistics.

Use of Campaign Funds

Ordinary and Necessary - O.C.G.A. § 21-5-3 (18)

Ordinary and necessary expenses shall include, but shall not be limited to, expenditures made during the reporting period for qualifying fees, office costs and rent, lodging, equipment, travel, advertising, postage, staff salaries, consultants, files storage, polling, special events, volunteers, reimbursements to volunteers, repayment of any loans received except, as restricted under subsection (i) of Code Section 21-5-41, contributions to nonprofit organizations, flowers for special occasions, which shall include, but are not limited to, birthdays and funerals, attorney fees connected to and in the furtherance of the campaign, and all other expenditures contemplated in Code Section 21-5-33.

REPORTING REQUIREMENTS

Affidavit of a Candidate's Intent Not to Exceed \$2,500.00 in Contributions and/or Expenditures: A candidate for nomination or election to a public office or the chairperson or treasurer of a campaign committee organized to bring about the nomination or election of such candidate signs and files with the appropriate official. A written notice that such candidate or campaign committee does not intend to accept during such election cycle a combined total of contributions exceeding \$2,500.00 for the campaign nor make a combined total of expenditures exceeding \$2,500.00 for the campaign in such election cycle.

Affidavit of Incumbent Not Seeking Re-Election: This affidavit is filed by incumbents who choose not to seek reelection in their election year. Once filed, the incumbent files according to the non-election year filing schedule.

Campaign Contribution Disclosure Report (CCDR): A CCDR is a report filed with the appropriate filing office by a candidate; public official; or the chairperson or treasurer of a campaign committee setting forth all expenditures and contributions. Itemize all contributions and expenditures more than \$100.00 and aggregate totals of all contributions and expenditures \$100.00 or less.

<u>Personal Financial Disclosure Statement (PFD):</u> Every public officer and every candidate for election as a public officer must file a PFD covering the period of the preceding calendar year. Only one PFD is required percalendar year.

Two Business Day Report (TBD): The TBD Report addresses the period of time between the last report due prior to the date of any election for which the candidate is qualified and the date of the election. The TBD Report requires the disclosure of all contributions (including loans) of \$1,000.00 or more and must be reported within two-business days of receipt of the contribution. Don't forget that the contribution must be reported on the next succeeding regularly scheduled Campaign Contribution Disclosure Report also.

A TBD must be sent by facsimile or electronic transmission (eFile) within two business days of receipt of contribution. Any facsimile filing shall also have an identical electronic filing within five business days following the transmission of such facsimile filing. Local filers should submit the TBD report to their local filing office. State/Statewide filers should file with the Commission.

<u>Termination Statement:</u> All campaigns and committees must file a termination statement within ten days of the dissolution of a campaign or committee which shall, among other things, identify the person responsible for maintaining campaign records as required by the Act. The termination statement shall be submitted with a final Campaign Contribution Disclosure Report which identifies a zero balance and zero indebtedness. This report is called the Final Report & Termination Statement.

Civil Penalties

A civil penalty can be assessed by the commission in a consent order and cannot be paid with campaign funds.
